- a. Getting more parishioners involved in attending Mass and not just dropping their children off for Mass
- Getting more parishioners involved in adult religious education programs

1C. Initiatives/Goals

- Consider taking a survey to assist us in seeing how we can attract those not currently attending Mass to join us in making our Community stronger

2. EVANGELIZATION

2B. Challenges St. Scholastica Faces Regarding Evangelization

- a. How to increase the number of Catholics who have drifted away to return

2C. Initiatives/Goals

- a. Ask active members to advise parish leaders on how to encourage "lost" members to return
- Find new and effective methods of communication that are effective in the 21st century
- c. Personally invite parish members to volunteer and serve as lay ministers
- d. Encourage those who show an interest in being a deacon or priest to learn the required abilities and pursue their vocation if they feel God's calling
- e. Be aware of all the goodness parishioners provide our Catholic Community and the community in which they live

3. CHARITY

- a. Go outside your church doors to care for people in need
- b. Advocate for and with people in need as the Gospel instructs us

3A. St. Scholastica Activities Regarding Charity

- a. Many of our parishioners volunteer at the West Suburban Pantry
- b. Our parish provides Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets to those in need as identified by the West Suburban Pantry
- c. Our parish supports the requested needs of the West Suburban Pantry
- d. Parishioners participate in the charity activities of the CCW
- e. We support Daybreak Transitional Housing and have 2 families in residence
- f. We participate in the clothing and household drives of the St. Vincent DePaul organization
- g. Roger's Writers attend to some of the incarcerated men and women
- h. We have a Bereavement Group to assist those coping with the loss of loved ones
- i. We have a Boy Scout and Girl Scout group who learn the skills of being responsible children for their church, community, and country
- j. Men's Scripture Study Group assists a local mission in serving lunch to the poor
- k. The Storm Youth Group volunteer to help those in need of assistance with projects they can no longer do alone, like raking leaves, cutting grass, etc.

3B. Challenges St. Scholastica Faces Regarding Charity

- a. To maintain our high level of commitment to all the programs we are currently involved in
- b. To not overlook other opportunities to help those whose lives we can impact
- c. Increase the number of participants in activities

3C. Initiatives/Goals

- a. Ask other members of our parish to participate as needed in these activities. A good place to do this is at our Hospitality Sundays
- b. Tell members of St. Scholastica where the need for volunteers is greatest
- c. Coordinate our efforts throughout all the Parish Council Commissions, so there is no duplication of planning and services
- d. Be flexible so that as unique and new opportunities arise to help our Community or that of Woodridge, we are able to respond
